In this workshop, Kjell Brataas will lead a discussion and give concrete advice on how to best communicate with and take care of those directly affected by a crisis, e.g. the bereaved, survivors and first responders. His topics will include spontaneous donations, the lay-out of a Family Assistance Center, the importance of personal belongings, monuments and site visits.
